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## PacRep Theatre and Hayward Lumber present David Ives' *The School For Lies* at Carmel's Outdoor Forest Theater

**CARMEL, CA (September 19, 2022)** , Pacific Repertory Theatre continues its 2022 Forest Theater season with David Ives' *The School For Lies*, playing September 29 through October 16 at the enchanted **Outdoor Forest Theater in Carmel**. PacRep's Forest Theater season is sponsored by **Hayward Lumber**, with additional support from the **Arts Council for Monterey County**.

A new comedy by award-winning playwright David Ives (*All In The Timing*, *Venus in Fur*), *The School for Lies* is an outrageously funny (and just a little nasty) spin on Molière's classic *The Misanthrope*. This outrageous 'translaptation' tells the story of Frank, a ruthlessly brutal critic of modern society and his collision with the equally acerbic young Parisienne hostess Célimène. Picking up on Molière's biting comedy on hypocrisy, Ives manages to lash out at 'contemporary' society with bite and a devastating humorous bile, complete with hefty borrowings from 'Shakespeare, reality TV, hip-hop stylings, and everything in between'. A raucous explosion of wordplay that skewers the 'Me' of modern times.

Keith Pinto stars as Frank, a Parisian noble who has only just returned to the city with an undeniable disgust for the upper class's two-faced manners. Frank starts off sassy yet overcome with misanthropy. Things take a turn when Frank meets Célimène (Jennifer LeBlanc), whose sharp wit has kept would-be suitors at bay. Then his friend, Philinte (Loki Miller) decides to pull a prank, tricking Frank and Célimène into each believing the other loves them. Or, at least, can get them out of serious legal trouble if seduced, in Célimène's case.

Then, Eliante (River Navaille), Célimène's younger cousin and the object of Philinte's affections, instead chases after Frank. Eliante at times seems to be a pure character until she threatens to kill Frank if he doesn't have sex with her on the floor of her cousin's drawing room. From there, the play piles on layer after layer of misunderstood intentions, a couple of mistaken identities, and plenty of slander. The steady flow of Ives' verse is hilarious and dazzling. It is so easy to get lost trying to guess the next rhyme and then get blindsided by yet another sharp and filthy joke. Célimène's three suitors (James Brady as Clitander, Nick Mandracchia as Acaste and Howard Burnham as Oronte) are the butts of most of it.

PacRep cofounder and perennial favorite Julie Hughett portrays Arsinoe – a bitter woman who is unpleasant, and thus unable to attract men, who masks her frustration with extreme manners and piety. She is openly critical of Célimène out of jealousy, as she herself seeks the love of Alceste. Meanwhile, comic favorite D. Scott McQuiston plays the dual roles of Basque, who is Alceste's jittery, bumbling manservant, and whose comic subservience to Alceste is a major element of the farcical nature of the show, out of nervousness in trying to tell Alceste everything, and Dubois, Célimène's servant, who consistently tries to serve canapés to the guests but always ends up having his tray upended.
